Description:

Mentors will be paired with a mentee and are expected to stay in communication as well as listen and answer any question their mentee may have. Throughout the year, mentors could be inquired about:

Key Responsibilities:

- Attend at least one mentorship training workshop hosted by the PTSA
- Meeting minimum 1h every 2 weeks with your mentee

- Act as a sounding board for mentee and provide them with academic, career and campus life advice should they ask for it
- Respect boundaries set upon you by mentees
- Continually provide feedback to the mentorship co-ordinators as well as complete any and all surveys related to the program
- Attend at least one focus group during the year
